



## What is happening in art class?

My website is a great place to read up on what your child is up to. I try to post weekly, and I also update my instagram account almost daily. Artwork is also in the hallways for everyone to see.

#### Is art class graded?

Yes! Lower elementary students earn a *Satisfactory* style score based on their participation, behavior and effort. Upper elementary earn letter grades, just like core subjects. I generally give a score right after students leave my room so it is fresh in my mind via Gradebook. Older students are graded mostly on effort, project completion and following directions.
